## VIII. Library Director's Announcements

San José Public Library Director Jill Bourne shared that today, September 20<sup>th</sup>, the San José Public Library and San José State University hosted the King Library's 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Approximately **350** people packed the Atrium on the first floor of the King Library where State, County, City, and University leaders shared remarks with those in attendance. The San José Public also unveiled ten new limited-edition library card designs that include elements of the library's public art and installations. We invite you to visit silibrary.org to view photos of the celebration and share your favorite King Library memory. There are new exhibits at the King Library. San José Public Library proudly presents *Pinoytown Rising: Filipino Americans in Santa Clara Valley*. This exhibit focuses on the "First Wave" Filipinos who immigrated to the U.S. and settled in Santa Clara

Valley, specifically in San José's "Pinoytown" during the first half of the 20th century. Experience artifacts, historical photographs, and various materials generously loaned by the descendants of these pioneers. The exhibit is on display at the King Library's California Room (5th floor) through November 30, plus a special event with guest speakers is scheduled for Saturday, October 14. San José Public Library also, proudly presents World on the Move: 250,000 Years of Human Migration, an interactive traveling exhibition that aims to expand the public conversation around the topic of human migration. - C. San José Public Library Foundation (SJPLF) Board: Vice Chair Ramos provided an update on behalf of the Library Foundation. At the August 24<sup>th</sup> Library Foundation Board meeting, Vice Chair Ramos was voted to be the Foundation liaison. Jennifer Lee, Attorney with Ares Management, is now a Board Member at Large for the Library Foundation. There was a presentation by Campaign Council, regarding the options for the Library Foundation to conduct a general fundraising campaign. To build permanent restricted endowment to ensure that the Library Foundation is able to maintain support for San José Public Libraries and perpetuity. The Board is going to consider whether to engage outside expertise for a feasibility study followed by a full campaign is 2024. The external auditors, for the Library Foundation, presented the 2022 final audit and tax filing. The Foundation raised over 12 million dollars. Largest amount to date. The Last of Authors Series will be held October 5, 2023, at Alum Rock Library.
