*San José Public Library Celebrates National Volunteer Week* - The Library celebrates its volunteers' diverse talents and expertise during National Volunteer Week, from April 23 through April 29. In the past year, **2,900 volunteers donated 85,000 hours** to support library programs and services. That is an increase of nearly 300 more volunteers and 7,700 more service hours donated than last year. Volunteers provide valuable resources to meet community needs, including English as a Second Language Conversation Clubs, computer tutoring, support as homework helpers, engagement as Friends of the Library, and involvement as Readers to Children. The annual celebration recognizes the important contributions that volunteers make in our community.

*Series of Naturalization Information Sessions Presented at the Library – [USCIS](#)* (United States Citizenship and Immigration Services) has partnered with the San José Public Library to offer a series of 8 bilingual naturalization information sessions, at no cost. The workshop offers a step-by-step description of the naturalization process, mock naturalization interviews with USCIS officers, and the rights & responsibilities of U.S. Citizenship; in addition, all attendees will receive a free DVD with all the current naturalization test preparation materials.
