

Wall of Wonder and Blossom Hill Vine



ABOUT THE PROJECT

Blossom Hill Vine is two large glass double-paned window systems at each end of the library's Marketplace. The glass is decorated with a series of images of local plants and historic artifacts painted in silver-leaf. The grapevine is a reminder of an earlier use of the neighboring land and the specific flowers were chosen on the basis of their geographic origin, a reference to the international nature of San José.

The *Wall of Wonder* is are wall-mounted steel panels in the Children's Area. The collection of building and entranceway images suggest the limitless potential of a child's imagination and the role the library can play in encouraging exploration.
