Parcel Tax History

- 1995-2005: Library Benefit Assessment District
- November 2004 Measure S approved
 - Parcel Tax: Sunset in 2015
- June 2014 Measure B approved
 - Parcel Tax, subject to inflation
 - \$25 per year per single family home
 - Proportional assessment for other property types
 - Effective July 2015 2040
