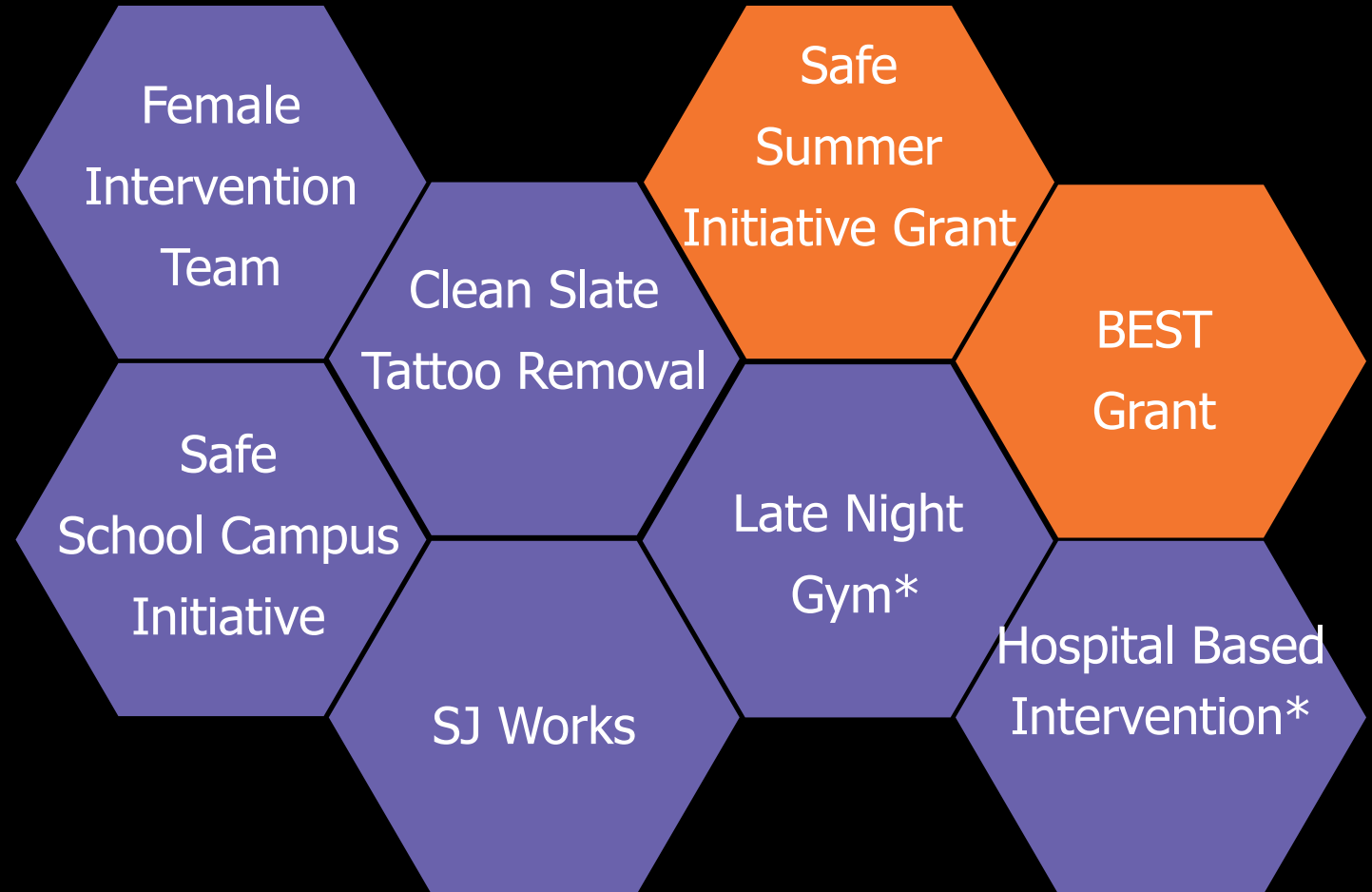

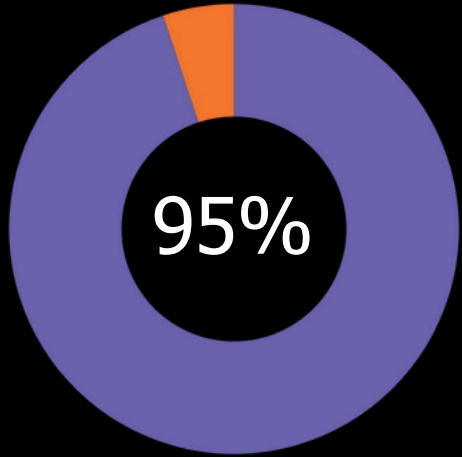


# UNITS OF SERVICE BY PROGRAM

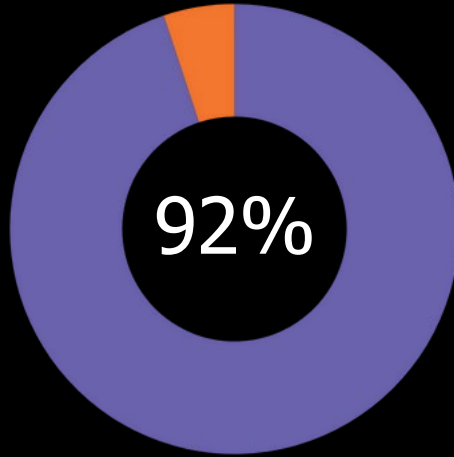




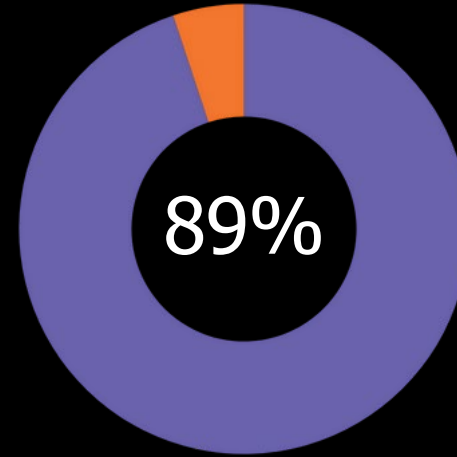
# PROGRAM OUTCOMES

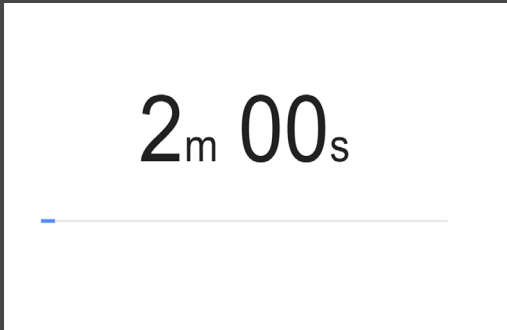
