**A. INFORMATIONAL: San José Public Library Summer Learning Program (P. Wilson)**

Senior Librarian, Paul Wilson, provided an overview of the San José Public Library Summer Learning Program.

Summer Learning Programs have 4 main goals

- Build strong and inclusive communities
- Provide fun learning opportunities
- Celebrate reading and literacy
- Reach and engagement everyone in the community

Summer Learning program

- Run through June 1 – July 31
- Offer to all ages in 5 groups
  - Pre-readers
  - Reader
  - Pre-teens
  - Teens
  - Adults

Lunch at the Library

- Pop-up libraries at local community meal sites
- Run from mid-June through July 31<sup>st</sup>
- Offer free books, Story times, and crafts
- Funded through a California State and California State Library Grant

Graphic Novel Making Contest

- Run from June 1 through July 31<sup>st</sup> – accepting comic submissions
- Branches run supportive programs to help participants learn how to make comics
- In 2024, 361 attendees these programs, 200 contest entries

**B. INFORMATIONAL: San José Public Library Expanded Learning (L. Nolan)**

Senior Librarian, Lizzie Nolan, provided an overview of the San José Public Library Expanded Learning

Trends:

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- 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reading scores shows 54% of students are reading below grade level
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade math scores show 50% students learning below grade level

Question of The Library:

- Who needs us (the Library) the most and how can we better serve them?
- Expanded Learning Unit focuses on topics surrounding these questions.
- Expanded Learning Workplan Items
  - Library programs:
    - Class visits and school outreach
    - Out of school times and after school program
      - STEM 2025
      - One in Math/BATA
      - Quality Standards process
      - Academic Support: Reading Partners
        - Support struggling readers and implementing this fall.
  - Library Cards
    - Student Cards
    - Educator Cards
    - School Library Card Day – enroll all students to the student library cards
    - Engage training and development
    - State Library Student Success Working Group preparing for 2026
    - Opportunities:
      - Final Report FY 24-25
      - MOU reengagement
  - SJ Learns and Tutoring Matters: High dosage tutoring, and low-ratio extended academic support for TK-8<sup>th</sup> grade
    - SJ Learns
      - Fall FY 24-25
      - 605 total students (69% goal)
    - Tutoring Matters
      - 2022-25
        - Served 33 schools
        - 3,038 total students

  - College and Career Pathways: funding will cut from City funding and transition to be funded by the San Jose Public Library Funding.
  - SJWorks: 15 subsidize positions will go to unsubsidized.
- Focus Area: Family, Friends, and Neighborhood Network: Library had a program to provide resources for childcare providers is up for potential defunding in FY 26-27.

  - 1. Most summer camps begin June 9

  - 2. Viva Parks Activations from 6-8 PM
  - 3. Paint the CitySJ
    - a. Offers painting class in the park
