

FY 2024-2025

Service Hours: No Change

Library Visits: 1 6.35% over 23-24

Circulation: Even with 23/24 (+0.3%)

- Changes to our electronic membership (E-Card)in February '25 impacted electronic material circulation
- Average wait times for electronic materials decreased by ~2 weeks for popular items

Membership: 763,555 ~ even with 23/24

 Changes to our electronic membership (E-Card) in February '25 impacted overall membership growth, but improved our ability to serve local residents

Total Visits – Up 6.35% from 2023-24



Most Popular Day of Week: Tuesday





- With the adoption of the FY 2025-26 budget, City Council approved the permanent <u>elimination</u> of late fees for all customers.
- As of July 1, 2024, customers will not accrue late fees when returning overdue materials which includes <u>all books, magazines, and media; Chromebooks, laptops, iPads, and hotspots; and ILL</u> and Link+ items.
- **All materials** checked out after July 1st will automatically be under the new loan rule and will not accrue any late fees when returned after their due date. Fees for lost materials will still be assessed.
- What happens with late fees accrued before July 1?
 - Customers with existing late and lost fees are still responsible for paying those fees. Customers can
 participate in <u>alternative</u> programs such as Volunteer Away Your Fines, Read Away Your Fines, or Book
 Replacement Program to paying those accrued late fees.

- An **AI Center** will open in late Fall on the first floor of MLK. Currently under construction. Will provide public technology access and skill building programming.
- Alignment of existing and new efforts focusing on Third Grade Reading
- Migration to a new Integrated Library System software solution, which will provide enhanced functionalities that will benefit the public
- Completion of the Facilities and Customer Service Master Plan
- Preparing for the renovation of the Biblioteca Latinoamericana Branch
- Through a grant from the Carnegie Corporation of New York, successfully building strong referral
 pathways for all program participants, with a focus ESL and Adult Literacy, and College and
 Workforce Development pathways
