Summer Learning program

- Run through June 1 July 31
- Offer to all ages in 5 groups
 - Pre-readers
 - Reader
 - Pre-teens
 - Teens
 - Adults

Lunch at the Library

- Pop-up libraries at local community meal sites
- Run from mid-June through July 31st
- Offer free books, Story times, and crafts
- Funded through a California State and California State Library Grant

Graphic Novel Making Contest

- Run from June 1 through July 31st accepting comic submissions
- Branches run supportive programs to help participants learn how to make comics
- In 2024, 361 attendees these programs, 200 contest entries
