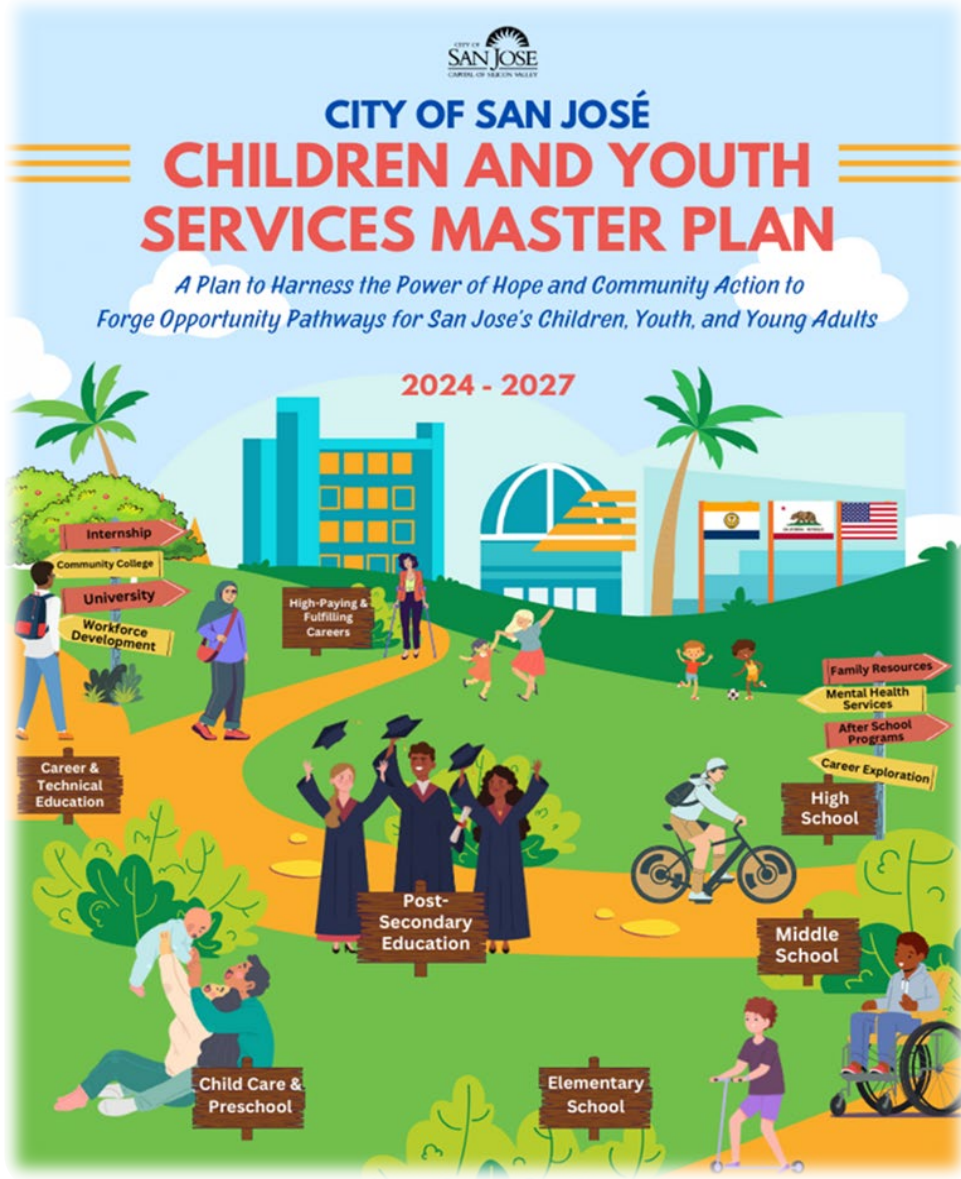

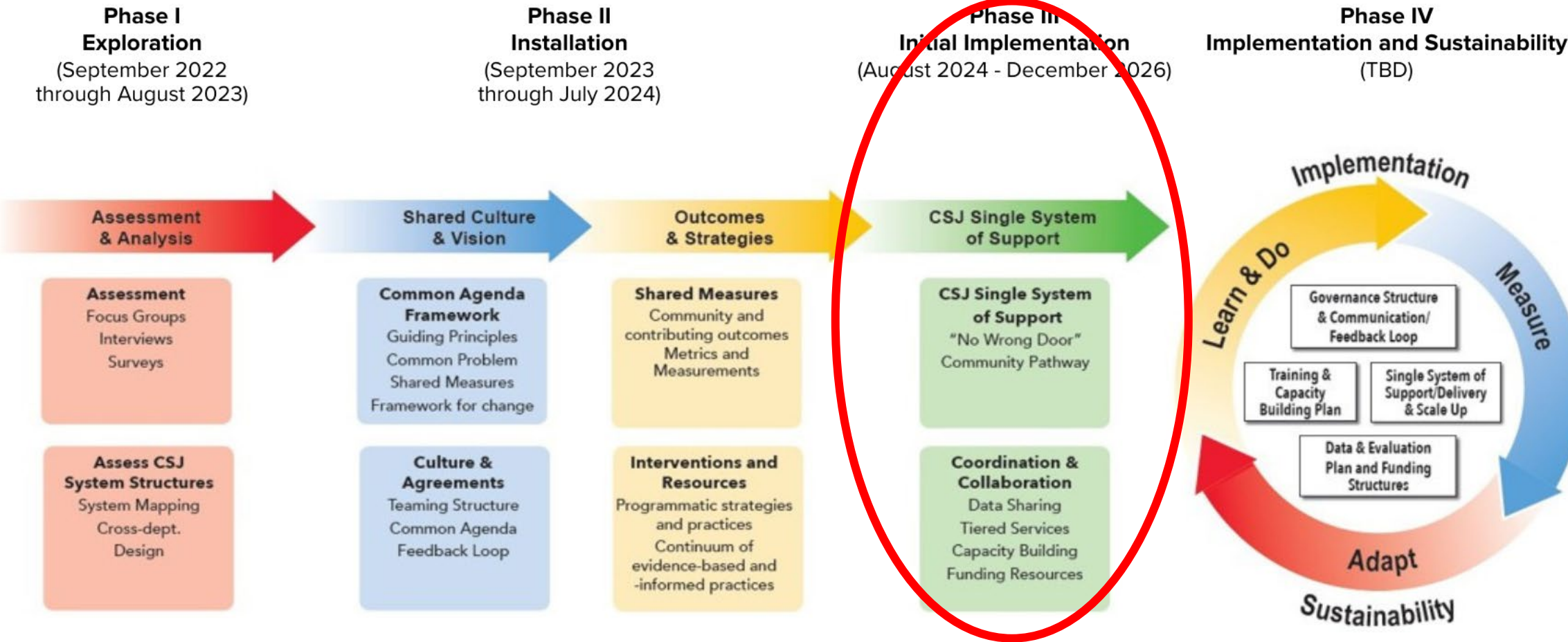

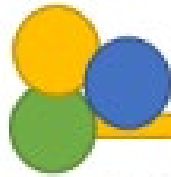


Demonstration Site 2

Integrated Service Delivery System





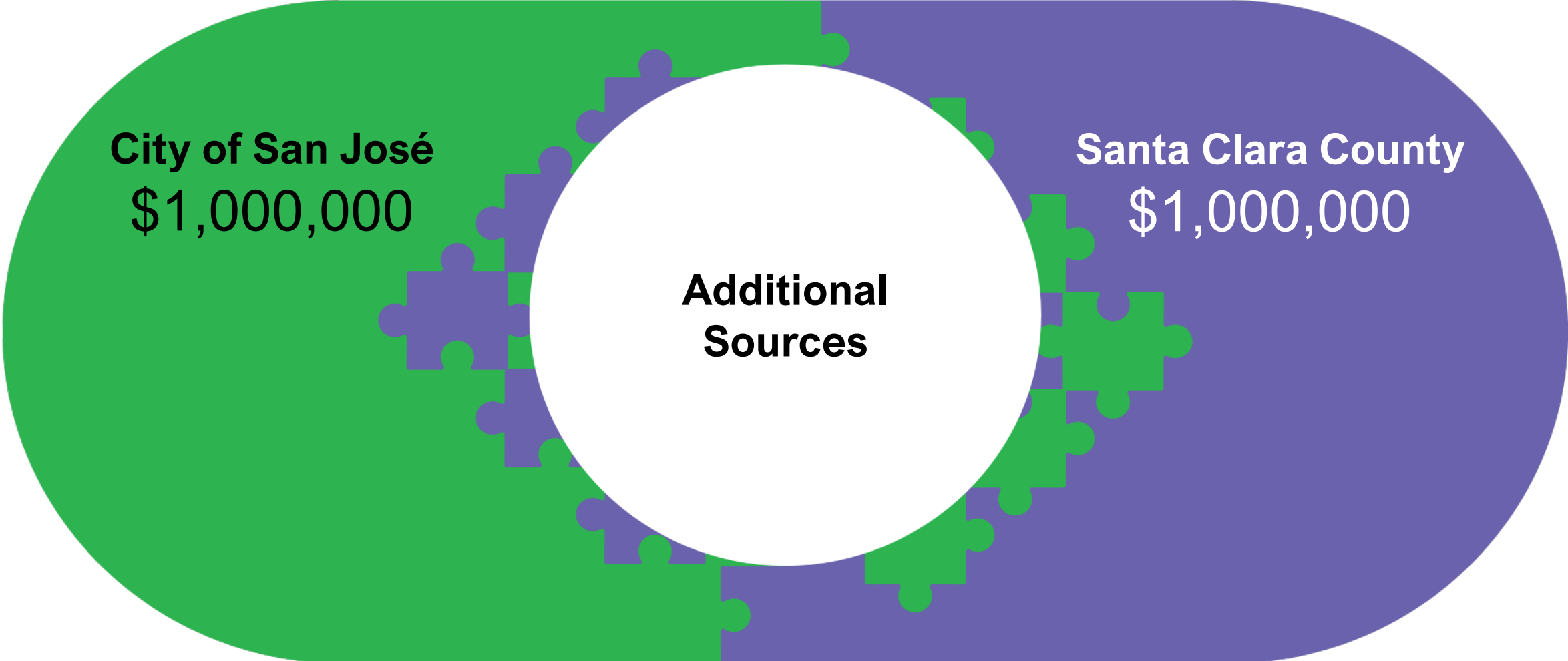

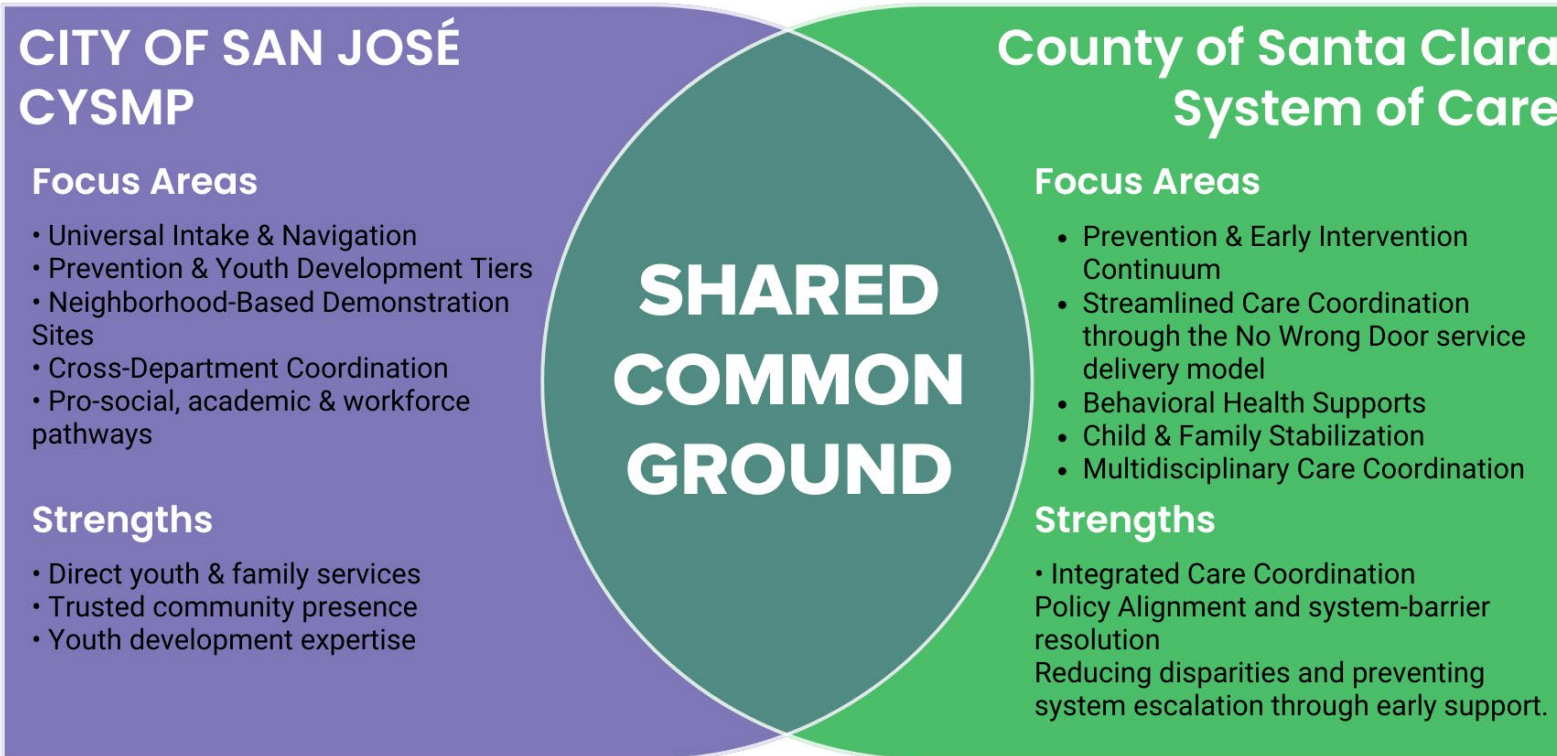

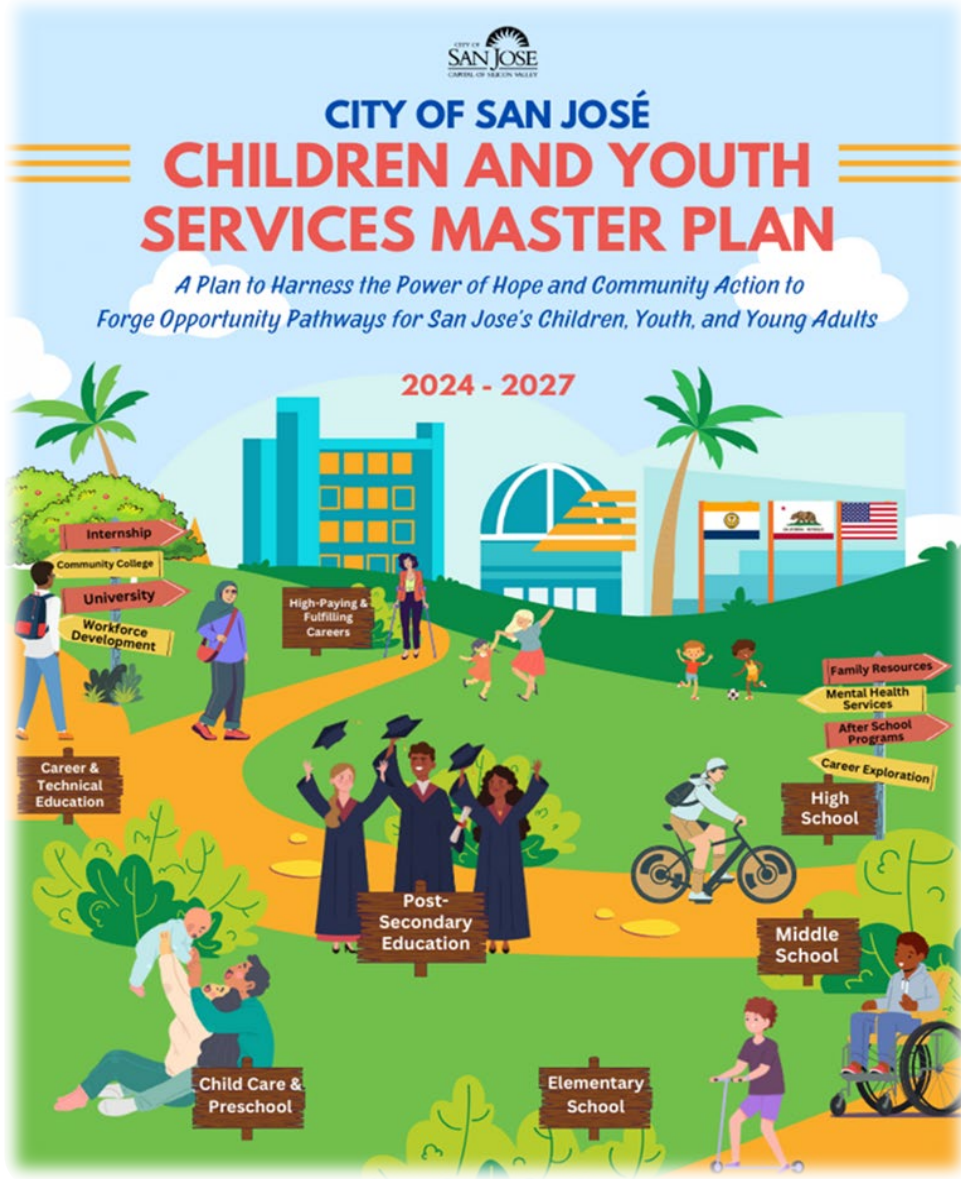
