VIII. Library Director's Announcements

San José Public Library Director Jill Bourne shared that more than 10,700 residents registered for this year's Summer Learning program, with more than 3,600 people completing the overall challenge of logging at least 8 hours or 8 books read. Readers logged more than 128,000 total titles and 4 million total minutes read. Participants in each age category who completed the program were entered into the grand prize drawing, with 125 winners being selected across the system. For a complete list of awarded prizes, visit: sipl.org/summer. The 15th Annual Graphic Novel Making Contest (GNMC) ended on Sunday, July 31 with 158 entries submitted from 161 participants. Entries were judged by SJPL staff and volunteers. Winners will be announced live at this year's GNMC Awards Ceremony, which is taking place at the Seven Trees Community Center on Saturday, September 9 at 2PM.
