

2023 SJPL Fall into Fiction Short Story Contest: World on the Move Edition Submission Guidelines

- 1. Contest is open to writers of all ages.
- 2. Contest is limited to amateur authors only.
- 3. Only one submission/entry per person/contestant.
- 4. Submitted work must be a fully original work.
- 5. Submissions created with artificial intelligence (AI) will not be considered.
- Entries must not have been previously published, self-published, published on a website or made public on social media, broadcast or featured among the winners in another competition.
- For entries written by those age 13+, entries must be submitted online via <u>Short Edition</u> <u>Portal</u>.
- 8. For entries written by those under age 13, you must submit your entry via email to shortstories@sjlibrary.org as an attached Word Document, linked Google Doc, or pasted into the body of the email.
- All emailed submissions must include a completed/signed <u>Contest Entry Form</u>. Please ensure all names, poem title, and contact info are accurate.
- 10. Contest runs from September 1, 2023 to September 30, 2023.
- 11. Entries must be received by 11:59:59PM on September 30, 2023.
- 12. Submissions will be categorized into 5 different age groups: 0-7, 8-9, 10-12, 13-17, 18+.
- 13. Submitted work must be no more than 4500 characters long, including spaces, punctuation, and special characters.
- 14. Submitted work must be for general audiences. We will not accept entries with explicit language or mature content.
- 15. All submissions must be proofread for spelling and grammatical errors before submitting.
- 16. Submissions must be text only. Images or drawings will not be considered.

- 17. All submissions will be judged according to the following scoring criteria.
- The judges read all the entries; their decision is final. Neither the judges nor San Jose Public Library staff will enter into any correspondence.
- 19. Prizes will be awarded to first, second, and third highest rated poems for each of the age categories.
- Prizewinners will be notified by email or phone (information used from <u>Contest Entry Form</u>) of their prize status.
- 21. Prizewinners will be announced on San José Public Library's Website.
- 22. Winning entries and selected works will be published in San Jose Public Library's online collection in <u>Short Edition</u>.
- 23. San José Public Library reserves the right to reproduce your work. You can reuse all your work after the contest.
- 24. San José Public Library staff may not enter submissions for the General Public contest. Library staff may enter into the staff-only contest.
